In 2022, planning staff met with the Electoral Area Advisory Planning Commissions (APCs) to discuss key themes and held open houses to gather additional public input. Planning staff have received a lot of public correspondence about the project, including key topics such as the proposed private moorage (dock) regulations. Staff are continuing to meet with the community and have prepared an updated October 2022 draft Zoning Bylaw that is available for additional public input before a final draft is prepared for the Board's consideration of first reading in Spring 2023. SOMASS WATERSHED FLOOD MANAGEMENT

The Somass Watershed Flood Management Plan (SWFMP) report and maps are on the ACRD website at www.acrd.bc.ca/flood-mapping. The Alberni Valley and Bamfield Committee have received the complete peer review and the critical information respecting options for applying the 200-year flood plain maps in the electoral areas are presented in the Plan by an engineering firm with local experience and knowledge in this area.

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SPROAT LAKE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The ACRD Fire Services
Review was completed in
2021, and consideration was
given towards how to most
effectively support the
implementation of the fire
service targets within the
SLVFD. The recommendation
is to consider the creation of a
full-time Fire Chief position for
the department.



The amount of time required to address all the operational requirements, training standards, records management, performance, and general management duties relevant to the oversight of a fire service team in excess of 20 members has gone beyond what can be reasonable expected of a volunteer Fire Chief. The ACRD believes it is unsustainable to place these expectations on a volunteer and see this as representing a risk to the Volunteer Fire Chief, the Department, and the ACRD. The 2023 draft budget includes consideration for a full-time Fire Chief position beginning in April 2023.

SLVFD Chief Mike Cann reports this spring the Sproat Lake FD will be completing its 10-year recertification for FUS (Fire Underwriters Survey). This is our water shuttle accreditation allowing residents in our fire protection area, who are within eight kilometres of an SLFD firehall, to have a reduction on their house insurance without the need of fire hydrants on a public water system. All residents and homeowners that live within the eight kilometre radius of a fire hall receive a DPG (Dwelling Protection Grade) of 3B(S) which is the equivalent of any fire department that has hydrants, whether they are volunteer or staffed departments. This accreditation was brought about in 2006 by then fire chief Chris Duncan, and the Sproat Lake Fire Department has worked diligently to maintain it ever since. Also, this spring the SLFD would like to hold an AED (Automated External Defibrillators) awareness session demonstrating the proper use of AEDs.

The SLVFD express the importance to keep your gutters clear of debris and your property clear of fuel sources in close proximity to the actual structure. Be sure address signs are visible. For information or purchasing a reflective address sign please contact them at 250-724-1777 and leave a message or send an email to officeadmin@sproatlakefire.ca. Remember, if we can't find you, we can't help!! The SLVFD will report out on the 2022 call outs at the SLCA AGM.

FIRESMART GRANT

The ACRD has applied for further grant funding to offer the FireSmart program in 2023. If approved, residents will be eligible to receive a \$1,000 rebate by completing the FireSmart recommendations provided by the Local FireSmart Assessor. Opportunities for curbside pickup of yard waste will also be offered to residents if grant funding is successful. COMMUNITY CONCERNS

Dogs on the Loose! ACRD Bylaw Enforcement has received several calls regarding potentially dangerous incidents of unsupervised dogs in our Sproat Lake neighbourhoods. They have been reported wandering on roads, in public park areas and on trails. As per ACRD Bylaw R1014, for the safety and protection of all residents, visitors, and pets, dogs must be supervised and controlled at all times. Please be respectful of others and ensure your responsibilities as a dog owner are never neglected. The Sproat Lake parks and public areas are for everyone to enjoy safely – including our pets!

Smarter Burning, Cleaner Living. Rebates are available to eligible residents who remove their uncertified woodburning appliance used for home heating and replace it with a cleaner fuel source. Formerly known as the Woodstove Exchange Program, the Community Wood Smoke Reductions Program offers options for households upgrading any woodstoves older than seven years (pre-2016) for cleaner burning fuel sources, like pellet stoves or electric heat pumps and save between \$1,000 to \$1,500. Please note that propane and natural gas appliances are no longer supported by this program. Exchange your old uncertified (pre-1994) for a new CSA-EPA emissions certified wood stove and save \$500.

Dog Mountain Slides Notice to all boaters to be cautious along the Dog Mountain shoreline due to debris falling along the Taylor Arm steep, rock bluff terrain. Since the fire July 4, 2015, there have been many slides witnessed along this area. Warning signage has been installed.



Garbage and Abandoned Wharves are all of our concern. If you are replacing and old wharf please ACT RESPONSIBLY! It is illegal to dispose of old wharves on Crown Land and the Province may charge removal to the owner. Please have old wharves disposed of in an environmentally safe and sensitive manner. Report illegal Poachers and Polluters by calling 1-877-952-7277 (RAPP), Cellular #7277, or report violation online at the Ministry of Environment Conservation Officer Service Report All Poachers and Polluters (RAPP) website. Thank you for your consideration of our water protection.

Sproat Lake safety on our rural residential roads - Due to the increasing population and development in our area there is an increase of traffic including commercial /industrial vehicles on our roads. Requests are coming from the community to please obey the speed limits and watch for pedestrians. Share the road. SLCA Road Committee met with MainRoad and Ministry of Transportation for the Winter Stakeholders meeting with regard to snow removal and maintenance plans. This spring they will be in Sproat Lake neighbourhoods identifying areas of community concern.

MainRoad contracting has a 24-Hour Public Hotline for calls reporting road and highway issues at 1-877-215-6008.

Mosaic Forest Management continues to engage with the Sproat Lake Woodlands Society, and we held another meeting together on Wednesday December 14, 2022. During the meeting we finalized a Memorandum of Understanding between the parties. We also provided preliminary information on future activities, which include some road re-construction/construction work scheduled for winter 2023, along with very preliminary plans relating to future harvest areas. We are planning our next meeting with the Sproat Lake Woodlands Society for this spring and will continue to provide updates in the next Sproat Lake Summer Newsletter. As we've done in the past, we will reach out to offer field walks of any areas that are considered for future harvest well in advance of conducting associated activities. Water source test bottles and requisition forms are available at the ACRD office for self-testing. SLCA group water testing is scheduled for Monday, March 27, 2023.

SLCA GROUP WATER TEST

SLCA Group Water Test for E. Coli and Total Coliforms at a discounted group rate of \$75 per test is scheduled for Monday, March 27, 2023. (This is a \$85.50 value plus free transportation to Courtenay lab and report.) Water sample bottles and requisition forms are continually available for individual testing at the ACRD Office at 3008 - 5th Ave. Monday to Friday 8 am to 4:30 pm or for THIS TEST at the Tseshaht Market, Sproat Lake Landing (Dellas Café) during business hours from March 10 until March 27, 2023. Water samples are to be taken MONDAY MORNING, March 27, 2023, and delivered with completed requisition form and payment of \$75 (to SLCA) to the Sproat Lake Community Hall on MONDAY, March 27, 2023 between 9 am - 11 am for transport to Bureau Veritas Laboratory in Courtenay. This is a great opportunity to test water filtration systems and lake sources, wells, etc. It is always advisable to treat or boil raw water. Free Septic dye tests are also available upon request at the ACRD Office.



SPROAT LAKE PARKS AND TRAILS

Lake Parks and Trails continue to provide active lifestyle opportunities to our community residents and visitors. Whether you like to swim, play tennis or pickleball, floor hockey, utilize the children's playground, the bike skill park, play baseball, run in the upper field, or simply walk on the trails. The SL Parks has an activity for all ages and abilities.

Adding to our compliment of parks and trails is the now completed Lakeshore Trail extension (pictured above). This trail now runs from Sproat Lake Provincial Park to the Sproat Lake Landing. Parks and trial maintenance is considered in the ACRD annual budget. This last trail extension was paid with Canada Infrastructure Program grant in the amount of \$140,000.
